Professor Robert Iansek (B.Med.Sci MB.BS Phd FRACP)

Professor Iansek has 30 years of research experience, has published over 150 articles, books and videos. He used his research knowledge to develop a specific multi-disciplinary rehabilitation approach to the lifelong treatment of Parkinson's. He is an internationally recognised expert Neurologist in the treatment of Parkinson's and is often a keynote speaker at international conferences.

Professor Meg Morris (Phd, MAppSc, Grad Dip (Gerontology), BAppSci (physio),FACP.

Professor Morris is currently the Head of School at Melbourne School of Health Sciences. She is an internationally recognised expert in Parkinson's and movement disorders. She has published over 150 articles and amongst other things is the chief investigator of research funded by the Michael J Fox Foundation researching the effect of physiotherapy on falls in Parkinson's Disease.
