Movement Disorder Programs (MDP)

MDP's are services/facilities which specialise in the treatment of Parkinson's and related conditions. MDP's offer inpatient and outpatient services to people living with Parkinson's. Community Health Centres

Your local Community Health Centre offers a range of health professionals who provide their services at minimal cost.

These include: physiotherapists, occupational therapists, dieticians, podiatrists, speech pathologists, social workers and counsellors, as well as other allied health professionals, who can play a useful role in helping you and your family to manage your Parkinson's more effectively.

Victorian Aids and Equipment Program (VAEP)

The Victoria aids and equipment program provides assistance to eligible people to access subsidised aids, equipment and home modifications to enhance their safety and independence. A health professionals assessment is required to determine the most appropriate equipment.

Aged Care Assessment Service (ACAS)

ACAS provides assessment and consultative services to older people, younger people with disabilities and their carers who are finding it difficult to manage at home.

ACAS consists of health professionals who can provide a thorough assessment of care needs and offer advice on future options. They can also assist in finding appropriate community or residential care.

Home and Community Care Services (HACC)

Home and Community Care Services are available through every local council throughout Victoria.

Services provided include: home/personal care, Meals-on-Wheels, social support and respite services.

Community Aged Care Packages (CACP) & Extended Aged Care packages (EACH)

Aged Care Packages are available for people to remain in their homes independently. A case manager will coordinate the allocation of services.

Linkages / Community Options

These packages are available statewide through the Department of Human Services (DHS), Disability Services.

The Department tailors packages for people with complex care needs, which can “top up” services already available through HACC.

These are generally available for people who are under 65 years of age.

Independent Living Centre (ILC)

The Independent Living Centre assists people with disabilities to enhance their independence and quality of life by providing advice, assessment and information on daily living equipment.

The centre has a large range of equipment on display and items can be demonstrated by staff and tried by visitors to determine which equipment best suits their needs.

Advice on equipment is given in-store by qualified therapists.

While equipment is not sold by the centre, information about suppliers and other services is available.
